"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." Psalm 23: 5

As the glass transitions quickly from full to overflowing, orange juice spills all over the counter. If you are anything like me, your first thoughts might turn from irritation to problem solving as you sop up the mess before it becomes larger. God's providence and abundance as captured in Psalm 23 is not likely to be on my mind. Though, I am eager to get the stickiness off the counter. However, my teaching on Psalms Bible Study is having an impact on me, and I recently paused to consider the connection. To say that my cup overflows is to say I have more than I need. What will I do with my time, my abilities, my prayers, my gifts, my service, my things?

Giving is not just about what flows over. If we only give your family the time left over, we will miss out on countless connections and opportunities. If we focus on giving our employer the abilities that are left over, there may not a job for long. If one's prayer life has only leftovers for intercession, we lose out on the power of God in transformation. If we give excess of our money to God, our discipleship still has room for growth. We have left spiritual formation on the table. Change is still coming for us!

Most of us have felt some significant change this year. Some of us have felt it in job changes, whether it is shifts in where we work or how we work, or if we have a job. Some of us have experienced changes in our health. With a global pandemic in play, our health resources are stretched thin, including personnel and supplies. This has impacted some routine healthcare as well as ancillary services. Many of us have navigated new normal in how we relate to family and friends, neighbors and colleagues with social distancing and healthy practices. Supply chains of food and other resources have been impacted causing inconvenience and sometimes life-threatening situations. With travel limited for many, families across communities have connected through virtual means. Change has been afoot.

Even in the presence of a global pandemic, God prepares for you what you need. Let me say: If you find yourself in a place, where you do not have all that you need, please contact me. Let's work together on enough food to eat, safe place to sleep, warm clothes to wear, and work with purpose. And your cup will overflow. I am moved by the ways in which people have shown up for one another. We are preparing for DVD ministry, so that ALL of our church family can be in worship together. This would be particularly our church family who are not connected online. If you would benefit from receiving a DVD of worship, please let Pastor Margie know.

Over the course of the next month, we will be talking about discipleship of giving. One of the themes that came out of our meet and greets was a desire for increased communication about our church finances. Additional opportunities for that will be forthcoming. We are all in this together, and we will be trustworthy and transparent in our work. On November 15<sup>th</sup>, we will invite you to share with us a commitment of giving. It may be new to you to have your pastor care for giving in this way. I appreciate that. Pastors are called to be confidential and care for us in the most vulnerable moments of our life. Our financial reality reflects our life reality. When pastors see pledges change or giving change, it means that something is happening that might require pastoral care. Tracking changes in giving patterns allows for pastors to deepen their pastoral care opportunities. Thank you for trusting me as your pastor. Integrating giving information, we will be presenting a 2021 budget at the end of November for consideration of the church. God has set a table before us, even in the midst of a pandemic, anointed us for such a time as this to be the church, and our cup overflows! Join me in prayer as we prepare together for this time of ministry to a changing world.



## **Save the Date!**

Our Mission Link has a history of together packing meals for those in need. We are looking into the best ways to continue that tradition right now. Here is a message from Pat Braun at East Stroudsburg UMC, who is taking the lead on this mission:

Thank you for your interest in this year's **Meal Pack for Haiti**. At this point we do not have firm plans except for the dates - **Friday, November 6 and Saturday, November 7**. The ministry we are working with, **Lifeline Christian Mission**, has restarted their meal packs, so they have experience doing it safely. We will follow all coronavirus safety precautions that are in place in Monroe County at that time.

We understand the constraints that are on us this year, but food insecurity in Haiti has become worse and we feel that God wants us to move forward with this year's meal pack. Because of these constraints, we will accept any funds and people that are willing to come help trusting that God will provide.

The meals cost 25 cents each, and it is estimated that each participant packs 150 meals, yielding an actual cost of \$37.50/packer.

The members of ESUMC has been challenged to set aside 25 cents every time they eat a meal from now until November 6 and donate that amount to the pack, even if they are unable to participate (It should add up to \$30-\$40). Perhaps your members will be willing to do the same.

Our Mission Team meets next week and we will further discuss logistics, so expect to hear from me again. I am happy to answer any questions that you may have and look forward to meeting those newly assigned to the area.

Look for more details to come! Pray about how God might be calling you to give of your financial gifts, your time and/or your prayers.

## **Oasis of Love Food Pantry**

During September, Pastor Monica met with Frank Medero, director of Oasis of Love, to be brought up to speed on current operations during the pandemic. Your Property & Building Team have several projects planned to ensure our members and visitors are safe in addition to securing and preserving our building.

By the time you read this we will have installed two Emergency EXIT lights within the sanctuary by Hartmann Electrical Contractors.

The repair of our cracked chimney is complete and some youth room exterior brick grout was patched by Stonecraft LLC.

We have contracted with Select Security to upgrade and monitor our fire alarm system.

When SuperHeat comes for the yearly boiler maintenance, they are going to try to address the steam leaks from the 2 horizontally placed radiators located in the kitchen ceiling. Hopefully, this will reduce some of the issues discovered in the kitchen.

We will be addressing other areas throughout the church to aid in accessibility. Just to name a few, we have two newly painted Handicap parking spaces in our parking lot. One is Van Accessible. New signage will be installed at the front of the building directing Handicap Access is available at the rear.

An area of concern for a long time has been our restrooms. We have consulted with several contractors to create ADA Accessible restrooms by remodeling some of our existing facilities.

We will be forming some work party days in the future to refresh the other men and ladies rooms, replace the courtyard porch roof, paint the repaired chimney, etc. Please contact any P&B member if you can assist with this endeavor.

The two appraisals for our stained glass windows to scrape and paint the sanctuary stained glass window frames, soffits and doors are \$18,000 and \$10,100. Any suggestions for fundraising to pay for this much needed project will be greatly appreciated.
