Veterans & Saints

This year we are celebrating All Saints Sunday a week later than usual. There are two good reasons for this. First, we wanted to conclude our "First Fruit's Campaign," which concludes on November 4th. This first week in November is typically set aside for All Saints Day. Secondly, Veteran's Day falls on a Sunday this year, so we decided to celebrate both Veteran's Day and All Saints Day on November 11th this year.

We hope you will come to worship to help us celebrate these two very important occasions.

Veteran's Day is a day set aside for our country to honor and remember all the veterans who dedicated and sacrificed themselves for our great country. President Woodrow Wilson first proclaimed Armistice Day for November 11, 1919. Here is some of what he said when he proclaimed this special day after World War 1:

"To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations."

Seven years later, Congress passed passed a resolution requesting President Calvin Coolidge to issue another proclamation to observe November 11 with appropriate ceremonies. A Congressional Act in 1938 made the 11th of November each year a legal holiday. In 1945 the idea was expanded to honor all veterans,

not just those who died in World War 1. And in 1954, Congress amended the act to replace "Armistice" with "Veterans." The holiday has been known as Veterans Day ever since.

All Saints Day is typically celebrated on the first Sunday of November. Some people think that only the Catholic Church honors and celebrates saints. In the United Methodist Church, we believe that "saints" refers to all Christians. Yes, because we are human, we are sinners, but because we are made in God's image, we are also saints!

We celebrate All Saints Day each year by remembering and honoring those in our church family who died in the preceding year. We often celebrate this special Sunday on the same day as Holy Communion and the Great Thanksgiving is the place we honor and remember the saints.

This year, however, we are celebrating All Saints Day on the same day as Veteran's Day. We will honor all our veterans and in a separate celebration this day remember and honor the saints of our church who died this past year.

We hope you and your family and friends will join us for this special time of worship as we honor these important people!

Commitment Sunday is November 4 and your pledge is so very important as we complete the budget and determine our estimated income for next year. Again, we ask for your prayerful consideration of your financial support to SUMC so that current programs can continue and new programs begun.

THE FEED THE HUNGRY PARTY THAT ALMOST DIDN'T HAPPEN

It was the third Tuesday of the month, and the prayer group, Women of Thunder could not feed the hungry as they usually do, because we have our Terrific Tuesday dinner. However, these women were planning on having a "tailgate party", serving sandwiches and a cold drink in our parking lot, beginning at 5 PM. so as not to interfere with our dinner.

It was almost 5.30 PM and the parking lot was filled with hungry folks waiting for their sandwiches, but no one had come to serve them. Peggy called me to find out if I knew why the women hadn't brought the food. I did not know, but said that I would make some phone calls. I called Eileen but got no answer. I drove to the church, saw Bill come out and tell the people gathered there, that there must have been a misunderstanding, and there would be no meal tonight. He overheard one father tell his children that they would not get any dinner.

Meanwhile I had called Eileen's husband for information on where the women were. He said that he would call Eileen's cell phone.

People were leaving the parking lot very slowly when suddenly someone said that there would be food after all.

Around 5 Pm Eileen happened to be driving on Ann street and saw a lot of people in the church parking lot. She wondered what special event was going on at the church. She continued driving to her husband Moe's business further down the street to pick up a check that had been given to the Prayer Group for food for the hungry. She was going to deposit it. As she drove away her cell phone rang. it was Moe saying that I had just called him wondering where the group was with sandwiches. Suddenly Eileen realized that all those people were her people waiting for some sort of meal. She was upset, she had no money, what was she to do? OH, but she did have a check, the donation. She drove around the block, back past the church on Ann Street, just as people were leaving. She stopped and said: "Wait, don't go, I'll be back with sandwiches."

Back to her husband, got cash for the check, drove to McDonalds, went in and explained the situation to the manager: I have \$50. May I buy 50 items from the \$1. menu and not pay the tax. I have 50 hungry folks in a church parking lot waiting for food: The manager agreed. Eileen rushed back to the church. As she opened the car door, one little girl asked her, if she was the lady bringing them food.

But it gets better! Someone in the crowd asked if there was anything to drink.

John, who lives under one of the bridges said that he had an access card. If anyone would drive to ShopRite, he would use the card to buy drinks. So two cases of soda were provided.

While Eileen was busy handing out items, she noticed that the church members arriving for their Tuesday dinner were quite uncomfortable surrounded by so many strangers, so she herded her people, as she refers to them, as close to the dumpster as possible.

The best part was that two women who were new volunteers in the prayer group and didn't know that there was no meal on the third Tuesday drove in with cupcakes they had baked. Now the Feed the Hungry Party was complete--there was also dessert!
