Living in Rhythm

Music has rhythm and time. A score of music will indicate the time, like 4/4, and the beats per minute. Keeping time as we sing and/or play music is critical. As a drummer, I know the importance of keeping time but it is not always easy to do—it takes practice. Sometimes we drag or fall behind in time and this can put the singers in a bind.

I feel like I am dragging time in the rhythm of life these days. Life, like music has rhythm and time. We do not indicate it or talk about it as much as we do in music, but it is still present. When life is out of sorts for us, it might be because we are dragging or rushing our daily rhythm.

Music has a feel to it. Different genres and different times help to define this feel. I think this is partly why music speaks so well to us. Life feels different at times, too. The Coronavirus has affected the rhythms of our daily lives in tremendous ways. What we used to take for granted we can no longer do, or can only do in drastically altered ways.

One example of this is funerals. The whole area of death and dying has been altered due to the virus. Most funerals are put on hold now and some are being held with just a very few family members present. I've often said in the past that one of the saddest funerals I've done over the years is when only a few people are present. Sometimes this was due to a person outliving their contemporaries and even their children. I recall a few funerals I've done where only 3 or 4 people, besides me, were present. These are sad funerals. Now, they are becoming the norm.

This might sound wrong, but funerals are for the living. The process we go through at a funeral is to help the survivors in their grief over the one who died. The one who died is already okay and in heaven with God. Those who are left behind struggle with their loss and the grief this brings to them. Now, the rhythm and feel of funerals has been drastically altered and the consequences of this will have a huge impact. The grief process will now last much longer than it did before these changes were made.

Other changes in our daily rhythm will also have a lasting impact on us. When we were created by God, we were not meant to live alone. God made it clear in the story of creation that a companion had to be found for Adam. The solution to this was Eve. People, by their nature, are social. We need each other. God did not create us to be alone or keep at a distance from others.

I am concerned about the long-lasting affects of our lock downs and how it will affect us in the future. For example, will there ever be a time in our culture again where it is okay and proper to shake another person's hand or give them a hug?

Our daily rhythm has changed dramatically. I hope and pray we can get back to normal soon. But even more, I pray that we can get back to the rhythm God intends for us.

The cost of materials is \$3683 plus the labor for the wallpaper. We hope you all, and Pastors Bob and Monica will enjoy the new surroundings.

The COVID pandemic and subsequent social restrictions have hindered a lot of planned tasks in and about the church. However, there are numerous projects we can accomplish as these restrictions are lifted.
