"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Enter God's gates with thanksgiving, and God's courts with praise. Give thanks to the LORD, bless God's name. For the Lord is good; God's steadfast love endures forever, and God's faithfulness to all generations." Psalm 100:1,4,5

At the end of September, I invited our congregation to change, or at least be willing to change. You might recall on that Sunday; I suggested a few ways in which you might change by creating tiny habits. One of those ways was to place your Bible beside your recliner in order to read the psalms, day by day. I began this practice on October 1st. Reading psalm 1 on the 1st of the month, psalm 2 on the 2nd and so on. I wonder how many of you joined me in this practice. I have enjoyed a devotional reading of the psalms in addition to my other biblical reading. For those who are studying the psalms with me on Wednesday mornings, it has been a part of my prayer practice as I hear the names of God to pray to God as the Almighty, the Shepherd, God who sees me.

I still have a number of days, until I get to Psalm 100. However, I know this psalm well. This psalm is read in celebration of Thanksgiving, and many will recite it. Looking back into my grandmother's papers, this psalm was required recitation for confirmation. Did any of you learn it for confirmation or other purposes? The psalm reminds me of Thanksgiving, gathering of family, tables overflowing with food, and laughter. Enter God's court with praise for God is good. Praise comes from a place of gratitude and generosity.

I invite you to join me during the month of November on a gratitude challenge. It is easy right now to think of how inconvenient, how frustrating, how upsetting the world around us is. Things are not as we would like. And in the midst of this uncertain time, we are called to be grateful. We are not asked to wait until everything sorts itself out. I invite you to join me in gratitude. You might make a note in a gratitude journal or write into your planner. If you are on social media, like Facebook, we will share the prompt each day as a

reminder and an invitation to share. When we write or share our gratitude, we join the psalmists in raising our voices in praise. I also notice for myself, looking back across years, I find my gratitude grows reading the memories of what I have been grateful for in the past.

I have my notebook ready, and I am ready to post. I can't wait to see how God moves through our gratitude.

Hebrews 10:24-25 "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Your Property & Building Team have several projects planned to ensure our members and visitors are safe in addition to securing and preserving our building.

We have contracted with Select Security to upgrade and monitor our fire alarm system. It was discovered during the process that, out of the 26 sensors located throughout the building, the 10 smoke detectors needed to be replaced at an additional cost of \$918. By the time this is published, the upgrades will be complete and the kitchen fire suppression system will be connected.

We will be addressing other areas throughout the church to aid in accessibility. Just to name a few, we have two newly painted Handicap parking spaces in our parking lot. One is Van Accessible. Signs are installed at the front of the building directing Handicap Access is available at the rear.

An area of concern for a long time has been our restrooms. We have consulted with several contractors to create ADA Accessible restrooms by remodeling some of our existing facilities. We are awaiting their estimates.

Our insurance company has asked for estimates of the church contents in order to update our policy. Mr. Rob Reinhardt, Auctioneer/Appraiser is preparing an estimate of the overall building contents. In addition to that, and for a better understanding and appreciation of what Stroudsburg United Methodist Church possesses, the replacement value of our pipe organ is \$760,000 and our beautiful stained glass windows are \$1,133,400.

The two appraisals for our stained glass windows to scrape and paint the sanctuary stained glass window frames, soffits and doors are \$18,000 and \$10,100. Until we can fundraise the full amount, we have contracted with RM Frantz to scrape and paint the Main St, Good Shepherd, window and front door frame next spring for \$3800.

Thank you, Catherine Doane, for crawling out the youth room window and helping paint the repaired chimney.

We will be forming some work party days in the future to refresh the other men and ladies rooms, replace the courtyard porch roof, etc. Please contact any P&B member if you can assist with this endeavor.






The Story of Us has been our theme in worship as we seek to follow after the example of Jesus in discipleship. We will offer the opportunity for commitment Sunday on **November 15**^{th.} We invite all of our members and friends who commit to giving in 2021 to offer their cards for consecration, asking God to assist them in their commitments as well as bless their gifts. Our Stewardship team will be developing our 2021 at the end of November, based on the commitments of the congregation.

Part of the story of us is telling the story of money openly. Our 2020 budget has been \$285,235. With your generosity, we have served God in incredible ways. During this year of pastoral transition, we have blessed Pastor Bob, and greeted Pastor Monica and her

family. We have pivoted to offering online worship and continue to perfect our audio and visual experiences both for those in the sanctuary and worshipping remotely. We held our first local mission trip and continue to respond to the needs of community through our Soup Kitchen, support of Oasis of Love, and Family Promise. We offer Bible Study and small groups, as well as care for those in our church and our community. This is a quick snapshot. Our expenditures have decreased approximately 11% in the pandemic as we have adapted our

ministries. Thank you for your generosity that is rebounding to respond to our needs in our community. With the economic uncertainty and loss of jobs, giving was down 18% going into the summer. At the end of September, comparing September 2019 to September 2020 is only down 8%. I pray this also means many have found stabilization. Your giving changes you and the lives of



others. Look for your letter in the mail, and let the office know if you need one. Blessings as we recognize, release, reimagine, remember, restore, and redeem the story of us!
